Make a wanted poster for a famous real or fictional criminal e.g. Jack the Ripper, Mary Ann Cotton, Voldemort, Moriarty... Don't forget to include their crimes and a reward.	What was the job of an executioner? Why were they often masked? Design or research an executioner's outfit. Don't forget to label and explain your choices.
Listen to the news or read a newspaper for a week. Make notes on the crimes reported and how the criminal was punished.	Write an acrostic poem for crime or punishment.	Write a timeline of punishments throughout the ages.
